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Elementary Czech Language

Course Description:

This course is designed for you to learn the basics to get by when you stay in the Czech Republic. You may have heard that Czech is a hard language. It is true but you are not expected to become fluent in three months. The syllabus covers the essential areas for you to survive in everyday communication: the topics range from food and drink, grocery shopping, restaurant language, through directions and time to simple description of daily routine and your life in Prague. To get by, you need to learn the pronunciation rules as well as some key grammatical rules to be able to express yourself. At the end of the course, the students get halfway through the A1 level according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Teaching Methods:

The class is taught in the communicative method, with emphasis on real life tasks. The class activities vary to make sure all students with different learning preferences get opportunity to practice in a variety of ways. What we do in class always has a link to something outside the class. There are several field trips: to the restaurant, to the supermarket, to the streets in the center, where you can try out what you learned.



Homework assignments aim at individual practice of what is taught in class. Students are often given autonomous task to make the classroom content personally relevant, such as writing their own shopping lists, describing how they get to places they go to most frequently, or making a video about their own experience in Prague.

Throughout the term, you will be asked to hand in assignments. Students will also share a short presentation on a topic of their choice in the second half of the term and there is a final project (a short video) to be presented in the exam week at the end.
